### Intimate Friendship with GOD

*“Now therefore, be wise, O kings; be instructed, you judges of the earth. Serve the LORD with fear, and rejoice with trembling.”*  
—Psalm 2:10-11

What do you think God means when He tells us to tremble before Him? And why? In Psalm 99:1, we read, “The LORD reigns; let the peoples tremble!” Verse 3 says, “Holy is he!” So we are exhorted to take God’s supreme authority and pristine purity so seriously that we tremble in His awesome presence. Do we? Ever? There is a strong exhortation to those in leadership regarding this truth in Psalm 2:10-11: “Now therefore, be wise, O kings; be instructed, you judges of the earth. Serve the LORD with fear, and rejoice with trembling.”

David the psalmist understood this concept from his life of studying God’s Word when he said, “My flesh trembles for fear of You, and I am afraid of Your judgments.” (Psalm 119:120) This kind of genuine fear of the Lord is, sadly, greatly missing in the Body of Christ today, to our detriment.

God wonders why we have so little genuine fear of the Lord when He asks the question in Jeremiah 5:22, “Do you not fear Me? says the LORD; do you not tremble before Me? I placed the sand as the bound for the sea, a perpetual barrier which it cannot pass.” The more foreign all this may sound, the more we should understand how far we are removed from living in the fear of the LORD. And the more we should cry out to God to show us how to live by the standard of His Word. He will always reward that cry with revelation of truth.

In Jeremiah 9:23–24, we are told to glory only in the understanding that we have of the knowledge of God, and that His three main attributes

are steadfast love, justice, and righteousness. When we have understanding of God’s unconditional love for us, demonstrated by the price He paid for our redemption at Calvary, we will always feel secure. We know that we can approach Him at any time.

When we have revelation of God’s judgment and justice, along with His holiness, we will realize how we need to understand the importance of the

fear of the Lord, and how it works in daily living. Through His love we have acceptance. Through the fear of the LORD operating in our lives, we have His favor. There is a big difference.

The Body of Christ understands so little of the fear of the Lord and experiences so little of what it means to tremble in the presence of our awesome God. Could it be that we know so little of the discipline of silent focused worship? I often ponder with awe and wonder what thirty minutes of silent worship in heaven will be like, as described in Revelation. Also, while ever we are bound by our liturgy and traditions, God is restricted in releasing the outpouring of His Spirit upon us in deeper dimensions.

God longs to manifest Himself in far greater ways to His people. But He does not reward casual inquirers, only diligent seekers. When spiritual leaders are content with “church as usual,” then that is exactly what we will get. And we get it far too frequently. We need to get out of our comfort zones into where God is really in charge. There is a world of difference.

While it is very important to obey God because of what He says, it is even more important to obey Him for who He is.

“Let all the earth fear the Lord, let all the inhabitants of the world stand in awe of Him.”

#### REPENTANCE / FEAR OF GOD

Present yourself to the Lord and pray that He convicts you of any sin or idolatry in your life. (Rom 6:13-14, 12:1-2) Repent and cry out for the fear of God in these areas; receive it in faith. Intercede that the Holy Spirit will grant revelation of biblical truth and move upon the hearts of Church leaders, public officials, and multitudes of Christians to align themselves with the Word of God and to fear God for who He is. Offer thanksgiving for the Manhattan Declaration. (See Page 3)

#### ALL IN AUTHORITY

As 2010 begins, affirm the supremacy of Christ over the Obama administration, the 111th Congress, the Supreme Court, all U.S. embassies, agencies, and the 2.5 million federal workers. (Col 1:12-19, 2:15) Use IFA’s “Top 130 U.S. Officials” bookmark (“Prayer Guide” available on “Resources” at [www.ifapray.org](http://www.ifapray.org)) to intercede for President Obama, Vice President Biden, the Cabinet, staff, and families. Pray for your U.S. Senators, Representative, Governor, and state officials. Intercede for exposure and cleansing from corruption and bribery at all federal, state, and local levels. Pray that the Lord redeems and “improves” or “removes” all corrupt officials and bureaucrats.

#### SANCTITY OF LIFE / MARRIAGE

Offer thanksgiving for Rep. Bart Stupak (R-MI) and Sens. Sam Brownback (R-KS), Orin Hatch (R-UT), and Mike Johanns (R-NE) for their courageous fight for the unborn and sanctity of life, and against tax-funded abortion via health care. Repent for the Democrats’ willful inclusion of tax-funded abortion and other anti-life, anti-family, and anti-marriage language in legislation before Congress. Bless and pray for all working to maintain the sanctity of life, family, and marriage. (Deut 30:15-19)

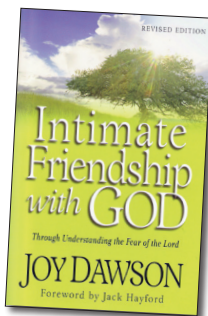
#### NATIONAL SECURITY / ISRAEL

## Praying Everywhere, Without Wrath

**“Let all bitterness, wrath, anger, loud quarreling, and evil speaking be put away from you, with all malice .... Pray everywhere, lifting up holy hands, without wrath and doubting.” —Eph 4:31; 1 Tim 2:8**

If people would have told us a year ago that the country would be in its present state, very few of us would have believed all that has occurred. There is a disturbing trend in the midst of all that is unfolding: some intercessors are so discouraged, frustrated, and angry that they can't force themselves to pray for the leaders that are in place. This is a more troubling reality than the current dire conditions!

An old proverb says, “Bitterness is like drinking poison and expecting your enemy to die.” This is applicable to us today. It is easy for us to complain, become overwhelmed by the pace of moral decline and negative change, and become bitter. Scripture warns that we must guard against this. (Heb 12:15) Instead of becoming beleaguered, bitter and passive, we need to continue to pray for our country's leaders. (1 Tim 2:2) We need to pray that God blesses them beyond present realities and past what we can even imagine. We need to pray that they experience the same redemptive grace that each of us has experienced—it is only the love and grace of God that can truly transform their hearts and minds. These words by General Robert E. Lee are a great reminder:

“Knowing that intercessory prayer is our mightiest weapon and supreme call for Christians today, I pleadingly urge our people everywhere to pray.... Let us pray for ourselves, that we may not lose the word ‘concern’ for those who have never known Jesus Christ and redeeming love, for moral forces everywhere, for our national leaders.”

Ultimately, bitterness is traceable to resentment toward God. How many of us have not at some time thought, from deep within our hearts, “Why have You allowed this, God? Why have You not intervened?” As we learn from these times, let us understand afresh that God has positioned man in delegated “federal headship” and dominion over this earth. He desires us to steward and “subdue” it. (Gen 1:28) Accordingly, let us see that God has charged us with the responsibility to mold this nation into what He desires. If we become bitter, we become paralyzed. Bitterness never fuels anything positive. All of us need to ask the Holy Spirit to show us His vision for America, and then pursue this with positive passion!

Julia Ward Howe, after visiting a Union Army Camp in 1861 in the early years of the Civil War, described a redemptive, proactive vision by writing “The Battle Hymn of the Republic.”

“Mine eyes have seen the glory of the coming of the Lord;  
He has trampled out the vintage where the grapes of wrath are stored;  
He hath loosed the fateful lightning of His terrible swift sword:  
His truth is marching on.”

When we forgive, it can feel as if we are minimizing what is wrong. This is a trap. Never is any wrong being done in our nation so grievous that we cannot forgive. The truth is that as we practice forgiveness we gain a greater ability to hear from the Holy Spirit. A heart of unforgiveness blocks our prayers and limits our ability to effectively focus our prayers on the specific issues that the Lord desires.

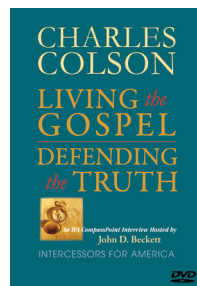

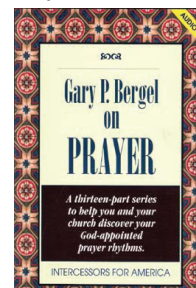

# The Manhattan Declaration: A Call of Christian Conscience

Drafted October 20, 2009 / Released November 20, 2009

Christians are heirs of a 2,000-year tradition of proclaiming God's Word, seeking justice in our societies, resisting tyranny, and reaching out with compassion to the poor, oppressed, and suffering.

While fully acknowledging the imperfections and shortcomings of Christian institutions and communities in all ages, we claim the heritage of those Christians who defended innocent life by rescuing discarded babies from trash heaps in Roman cities and publicly denouncing the Empire's sanctioning of infanticide. We remember with reverence those ... who died bravely in the coliseums rather than deny their Lord...

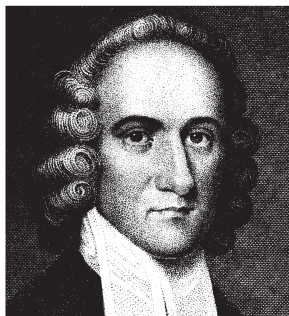
Like those who have gone before us in the faith, Christians today are called to proclaim the Gospel of costly grace, to protect the intrinsic dignity of the human person, and to stand for the common good....

## Declaration

We, as Orthodox, Catholic, and Evangelical Christians, have gathered, beginning in New York on September 28, 2009, to make the following declaration, which we sign as individuals.... We act together in obedience to the one true God, the triune God of holiness and love, who has laid total claim on our lives and by that claim calls us with believers in all ages and all nations to seek and defend the good of all who bear his image. We set forth this declaration in light of the truth that is grounded in Holy Scripture....

Because the sanctity of human life, the dignity of marriage as a union of husband and wife, and the freedom of conscience and religion are foundational principles of justice and the common good, we are compelled by our Christian faith to speak and act in their defense. In this declaration we affirm: 1) the profound, inherent, and equal dignity of every human being as a creature fashioned in the very image of God, possessing inherent rights of equal dignity and life; 2) marriage as a conjugal union of man and woman, ordained by God from the creation, and historically understood by believers and non-believers alike, to be the most basic institution in society, and; 3) religious liberty, which is grounded in the character of God, the example of Christ, and the inherent freedom and dignity of human beings created in the divine image....

*"I have often said it would be a thing very desirable, and very likely to be followed with a great blessing, if there could be some contrivance, that there should be an agreement of all God's people in America... to keep a Day of Fasting and Prayer to God; wherein, we should all unite on the same day... It seems to me, it would mightily encourage and animate God's saints, in humbly and earnestly seeking God, for such blessings which concerns them all; and that it would be much for the rejoicing of all, to think, that at the same time such multitudes of God's dear children, far and near, were sending up their cries to the same common Father for the same motives."*

## Life

"So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them." (Genesis 1:27)

"I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full." (John 10:10)

Although public sentiment has moved in a pro-life direction, we note with sadness that pro-abortion ideology prevails today in our government. The present administration is led and staffed by those who want to make abortions legal at any stage of fetal development, and who want to provide abortions at taxpayer expense....

## Marriage

"The man said, 'This is now bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; she shall be called woman, for she was taken out of man.' For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and they will become one flesh." (Genesis 2:23-24)

"This is a profound mystery ... I am talking about Christ and the Church. However, each one of you also must love his wife as he loves himself, and the

wife must respect her husband." (Ephesians 5:32-33)

In Scripture, the creation of man and woman, and their one-flesh union as husband and wife, is the crowning achievement of God's creation. In the transmission of life and the nurturing of children, men and women joined as spouses are given the great honor of being partners with God Himself. Marriage then, is the first institution of human society—indeed it is the institution on which all other human institutions have their foundation....

And so it is out of love (not "animus") and prudent concern for the common good (not "prejudice"), that we pledge to labor ceaselessly to preserve the legal definition of marriage as the union of one man and one woman....

## Religious Liberty

"The Spirit of the Sovereign LORD is on me, because the LORD has anointed me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives and release from darkness for the prisoners." (Isaiah 61:1)

"Give to Caesar what is Caesar's, and to God what is God's." (Matthew 22:21)

The nature of religious liberty is grounded in the character of God Himself, the God who is most fully known in the life and work of Jesus Christ.... Christians confess that God alone is Lord of the conscience. Immunity from religious coercion is the cornerstone of an unconstrained conscience....

As Christians, we take seriously the Biblical admonition to respect and obey those in authority. We believe in law and in the rule of law. We recognize the duty to comply with laws whether we happen to like them or not, unless the laws are gravely unjust or require those subject to them to do something unjust or otherwise immoral. The biblical purpose of law is to preserve order and serve justice and the common good; yet laws that are unjust—and especially laws that purport to compel citizens to do what is unjust—undermine the common good, rather than serve it....

Going back to the earliest days of the church, Christians have refused to compromise their proclamation of the gospel.... (Acts 4) Through the centuries, Christianity has taught that civil disobedience is not only permitted, but sometimes required....

Because we honor justice and the common good, we will not comply with any edict that purports to compel our institutions to participate in abortions, embryo-destructive research, assisted suicide and euthanasia, or any other anti-life act; nor will we bend to any rule purporting to force us to bless immoral sexual partnerships, treat them as marriages or the equivalent, or refrain from proclaiming the truth, as we know it, about morality and immorality and marriage and the family. We will fully and ungrudgingly render to Caesar what is Caesar's. But under no circumstances will we render to Caesar what is God's.

## WARREN: ABORTION IS A "HOLOCAUST"

★ NEW YORK, NY – Speaking on NBC's Meet the Press, Pastor Rick Warren, author of "A Purpose Driven Life," declared that Obama's present stance on abortion amounts to ignoring an American holocaust. "We have 46 million Americans who are not here. Those who should be here since Roe v. Wade are not, and are not voting." Slamming Obama's rhetoric that "abortion should be rare," Warren said such a position "essentially supports the idea that life begins at conception. . . . Either you believe it's life or you don't . . . why would you believe it should be rare? . . . If a baby, a fetus is not a life, then why restrict it?" Warren, who was invited by Obama and prayed at his Inauguration, said he prays for the president daily. (NM 11/29/09)

## THE HUNGRY NEXT DOOR

★ SEATTLE, WA – As the recession and joblessness continues, a growing number of Americans—some 50 million in more than 17 million households—are going hungry, eating less, and literally worrying about where a next meal is coming from. A federal survey shows an increase of 11.1 percent increase for 2008 over 2007. A greater increase is projected for 2009. For people struggling to make ends meet, putting food on the table is often a casualty of paying the rent, winter heating bills and the expense of health care. Donations and volunteer support for church and community relief efforts have a real impact on genuine need. Food banks help people living on the edge get through the month. Soup kitchens feed others with absolutely no options. (ST 11/18/09)

## MANHATTAN DECLARATION SPREADING

★ WASHINGTON, DC – The Manhattan Declaration: A Call of Christian Conscience was publicly proclaimed at the National Press Club on November 20. (See Page 2) The drafting was spearheaded by Professor Robert George, McCormick Professor of Jurisprudence, Princeton University, Professor Timothy George, Beeson Divinity School, Samford University and Charles Colson, Founder of the Chuck Colson Center for Christian Worldview, Lansdowne, VA. Initially signed by a core of 150 Christian leaders, the document was gaining signatories at the rate of 1,000 per hour in the week after release. ## BATTLING HOMEGROWN TERRORISTS

★ SPRINGFIELD, IL – The FBI arrest of "very normal" Michael Finton, alias "Talib Islam," in Illinois, the killing of Muslim Imam Luqman Ameen Abdullah, previously known as Christopher Thomas, in Detroit, and Major Nidal Malik Hasan's shooting spree at Fort Hood, Texas have raised the specter of Islamic Jihad unfolding across the U.S. Analysts report that Jihadists here are also beginning to use technology to mobilize and train terror agents in foreign nations. World magazine recently documented five more elaborate terrorist plots thwarted since May, 2009.

Sen. Joseph Lieberman (I-CT), who heads the Senate's Homeland Security Committee, determined the attack by Hasan, a U.S.-born Muslim of Palestinian descent, to be a "terrorist act" and convened hearings on the matter. Reps. Sue Myrick (R-NC), John Shadegg (R-AZ), Paul Broun (R-GA.) and Trent Franks (R-AZ), members of the Congressional Anti-Terrorism Caucus, have called upon the U.S. House sergeant at arms to investigate whether the Council on American Islamic Relations (CAIR) has tried to place interns or otherwise infiltrate key national-security committees in order to shape legislative policy. The lawmakers are specifically focused on the House Homeland Security Committee, Intelligence Committee and Judiciary Committee. (NTA 10/28/09 NYDN 11/08/09 TH 10/14/09 W 12/5/09)

## ARCHDIOCESE WARNS DC OFFICIALS

★ WASHINGTON, DC – The Catholic Archdiocese of Washington informed city officials that it will be unable to continue the social service programs it runs for the District if the city doesn't change the proposed same-sex marriage law, a threat that could affect tens of thousands of people the church helps with adoption, homelessness and health care. Under the bill, set for a DC Council vote in early December, religious organizations would not be required to perform or make space available for same-sex weddings; but they would have to obey city laws prohibiting discrimination against gay men and lesbians. Fearful that they could be forced, among other things, to extend employee benefits to same-sex married couples, church officials said they would have no choice but to abandon their contracts with the city. ## CAMPUS MINISTRIES GEARING FOR 2010

★ AUSTIN, TX – Campus Renewal Ministries ([www.campusrenewal.org](http://www.campusrenewal.org)) drafted Spark and Fusion Group manuals in 2009 and posted an online Spark course at year's end. These eight-week long video and interactive small group or online courses teach campus leaders and students how to plant missional communities, "simple churches," among a people group where they live, work, or play. It is anticipated that students on campuses in every state will take the course and launch missional communities.

KANSAS CITY, MO – Campus America ([www.campusamerica.org](http://www.campusamerica.org)) sees itself as a simple call for a connected, unbroken Year of Prayer in 2010 on college and university campuses across the U.S. Starting with "the torch-in-hand" in January, unbroken day and night prayer will be handed off to prayer rooms across the nation.

## STUDENT AWAKENING AT IHOPU

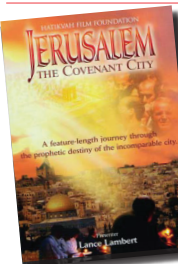
★ KANSAS CITY, MO – On November 4, on the last day of a monthly fast at the International House of Prayer University of Kansas City (IHOPU), a move of the Holy Spirit began to stir during the student chapel assembly. Students received revelation of God's love for them and testified about receiving deliverance from self-hatred, shame, and depression. A refreshing, joyous spirit rested on many students and the times of spiritual awakening continued in classes and faculty. Word spread quickly and over 2,000 people spontaneously gathered in the auditorium from all over the Kansas City area. Visitation and reports of salvation, deliverance and physical healings continued. Times of awakening were experienced via Webcasts by students at Wheaton College, Asbury Seminary, and other campuses.
